Prior to that visit I had dared to look in the drawers containing the packets of seeds but they were not in alphabetical order so I left everything as it was until I could have it all explained. Nita did that for me and also showed me the folders of collected plant material that had been sent to the Herbarium and returned with correct names attached.

Another treasure that was shown to me was an old label making machine. I was given permission to take the machine home to Brisbane to see if it worked. With the machine was a folder containing old invoices and

instructions. Most of the invoices dated back to 1998 or 1999 but lots of label blanks were purchased back then so I was confident that the machine was useable.

As luck would have it, when my husband saw it he commented that the Mens' Shed where he volunteers also has a very similar machine and the operator claimed that it was not too difficult to use.

It is a gravograph machine and when I started "googling" and phoning I soon found that there was an office not too far away. One thing led to another and soon I had tracked down a supplier of the signage material which is UV rated for exterior use.



Vale David Hockings



It is with great regret that we mark the passing of David Hockings AM, who died at Maleny on 17th July this year, after a long battle with illness. David was 89 years old.

David was born on Thursday Island in the Torres Strait, where his early fascination with the natural world developed, but moved to South East Queensland when his parents took up a dairy farm in Springbrook. David joined the Department of Agriculture and Stock (later to become the Department of Primary Industry) in its horticultural section in 1960. As David told it, he was asked to take an interest in the development of the ornamental plant industry, thus earning the enmity of his colleagues in "proper" commercial agriculture, not least because it created a new source of competition for scarce funding!

David not only took an interest in ornamental plants, particularly natives, but also in the insects that depended on them. In the early days of television he was a presenter on one of the early ABC television gardening programs, often having to deal with issues of plant health. This abiding interest culminated in his book, first published in 1980, and revised in 2014, "Pests, Diseases and Beneficials".

In 1985 David retired from DPI, intending to devote all of his time to the cut flower nursery that he and Olive had developed in Maleny.

Over time they developed markets for Australian native plants, both here and overseas, many of them new to horticulture, and often grown from specimens they collected in their numerous trips "into the bush". David was honoured with the award of an AM in 2007 for his services to horticulture.

David was a founding member of SGAP, later NPQ, joining when the society commenced in Queensland in June 1957. He was always willing to share his prodigious knowledge of native plants, and keen to engage others in this fascinating work. He gave many years of unstinting service in a variety of official roles in the society, and he and Olive have both been recognised for their service with the award of Life Membership.

David and Olive have many friends in the plant world, and large numbers turned up in Caloundra last month to honour a life lived to the full, with humour, exuberance and passion.

David, we will miss you, and we offer our sincere condolences to Olive, Colin, Cecily and Lindy, and their families.

Historical article by David Hockings, 1958

At the SGAP Meeting at the ABC Studios in Alice Street, Brisbane on 9 October 1958, David Hockings made the following report on his visit to David Gordon's 'Myall Park' property at Glenmorgan.

Visit to Myall Park (1958)

David Hockings reported that a visit to Myall Park had lasted four days during which they were faced with a bewildering amount of material. The property is in open forest country and the vast plantings are beautifully landscaped and cover well over 60 acres.

At the time of the visit the plants were just recovering from drought and, except for *Eucalyptus torquata*, the eucalypts were not in flower. *Calytrix longiflora* and *Hakea purpurea* were perhaps the prettiest display in the gardens.

The system followed at Myall Park is to plant a range of species in the one plantation. It was surprising to find that cultivation with rotary hoe was done right up to the base of the trees. Although there were occasional losses this cultivation apparently did little damage. David could not say how often the cultivation was carried out, but it was suggested that frequent cultivation would serve to encourage deeper rooting and would form a dust mulch on the surface.

Mr Gordon has his own seed collectors and hence, pending

identification, a lot of plants are labelled 'species'. The nursery at Myall Park is particularly well set up and at the time of the visit 1,500 plants were advanced to a stage ready for planting out. Tribute was paid to the excellent herbarium and to the fine work being done by Mrs Gordon in painting the Australian flora.

David reported that some coastal species were being grown and the Hymenosporum for instance was doing reasonably well. Coastal species seemed to be growing mainly in sheltered positions.

The property is about 1,500 feet above sea level and seems to be reasonably free from pests.

The soil in the gardens is a red sandy type on a ridge and probably has an average depth of approximately one foot. In some places the soil is being pushed up to give a greater depth to the beds.

Trees are set wide apart and some experimental work is being done with ground cover species. No fertilizer is being used, although some might be used in propagating.

Plants are watered when first planted out, but David had no information as to subsequent watering, if any. The water supply was from a dam which had recently been enlarged and Mr Gordon was hoping to be able to cultivate some swamp plants.

Notes from The Treasurer

Notes: Council donation must be applied for each year, so far no news of any for this upcoming financial year. If not forthcoming, then ??? re future as we obviously need \$50 000 + to keep operating at our current level each year.

Administration costs include - telephone; internet for office and caretaker; Vehicle registration;, electricity; insurances on buildings, voluntary workers and directors; pest control for white ants etc; postage; auditing;rates; eftpos costs.....all of .which we cannot really exist without. Auditing alone is about \$2000 pa and only because we have a tax deductible Gift Fund.

Accommodation – obviously one of our main sources of income, little has been spent on it, but obviously too, money should be spent on maintenance and upgrades, as these buildings are not new.

Retail costs – included purchase of 300 cookery books this year, helped by substantial donation of \$500 from Priscilla Mundell. – but not helped by the fact we were "scammed" for \$850a long story..... involved sale of a lot of china to a Singapore address, seemed OK on searching the website of the business, so we proceeded after money for the china and freight went into our account, the \$850 was freight MPBG to Singapore, and paid for by us but when a second order came in, lights started to flash, and I discovered "Scamwatch" on that business, so the second order not proceeded with...... It took almost 4 months before the money was retracted from our account! However, the fine china was never collected, we still had that!

Living Collection income included \$2 440 from Dorothy Gordon Grevillea royalties. Expenses include water and plant repairs; fuel; tractor, ute and pump maintenance, and new plantings.

Spring Day - please note no income or expenditure included from August 2017 Spring Day, as monies were not banked until October – I was away most of Aug and until late Sept, and not until I went to do the books did I discover there had been no banking from

Spring Day. It then came to light that the money was hidden away, awaiting banking! Interest above does not include that from term deposit.

Gift Fund – the only expenditure for the year was \$5024 for signage, and monthly account fees by the bank. We appreciate all donations, no matter what size – they all add up.

Plans for 2017/18 Recently directors voted to purchase a second hand ute, as the current ute is requiring more and more expensive maintenance to maintain its roadworthiness. We need a ute for caretakers to travel to do MPBG Ltd business.

Another plan is **to upgrade the accommodation** standard of Room 5, the biggest room in The Quarters. Funding for this would have to come from grants, or donations.

Unfortunately, according to the constitution, any money donated to the Gift Fund can only be used for "core business", ie the Living Collection itself, not for eg upgrading accommodation, although income from accommodation helps with keeping the Garden going.

We continue to apply for grants for a variety of things, but none have been forthcoming this last year. Grant applications are very time-consuming, so very disappointing when we miss out.

Decision to be made for the future – do we keep operating at current cost levels (which are as low as we can go) and deplete our reserves slowly, or spend all reserves on the above 2 plans in the immediate future, and hope something miraculous happens to keep the Garden running?
